Fort Bragg's New Namesake



Fort Liberty, a name change itself, “after one of America's core values” was officially re-named after Private Roland L. Bragg, a WWII hero, who served with the 513th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 17th Airborne Division, XVIII Airborne Corp.

The US DoD page says Bragg was born in Maine, June of 1923, the son of a WWI Army Veteran. He joined the Army at age 23, was assigned to the 513th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 17th Airborne Division, and was stationed at Fort Bragg.

Private Bragg received the Silver Star for "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity," and a Purple Heart for wounds sustained during the Battle of the Bulge.

Bragg died in 1999 and is buried in Dunbar Cemetery in Nobleboro, Maine. His obituary, printed in the Portland Press Herald, tells of being released from imprisonment by his German captors when they realized that he, too, was a Mason like them.

The original moniker was after Confederate General Braxton Bragg, a NC native, who was also a General in the Mexican American War. This Bragg is considered “one of the worst generals in history, as most of his battles ended in defeat with tremendous loss of life, consequential to the downfall of the confederacy. He was widely disliked pre -Civil War, in the Army, and amongst peers,” according to the renaming committee report.

The renaming ceremony took place on March 7.





Matt Cahill is a 26 year Army Medic that was medically retired in 2019. His father served in Vietnam and his sister served with him in the same med platoon in Iraq. I met Cahill last July, at the National Convention where he had an information booth. Being a Mission 22 Ambassador, I was immediately drawn in by his campaign. While we all feel strongly about the prevention of veteran suicide, some of us having friends and family that lost the battle, like Cahill, he reached his breaking point in 2020. "I lost my Veteran cousin, Wes Donnelly, to suicide in July, and a long time friend, Andy McCaffrey, in August. Something more had to be done, many organizations existed to raise awareness about veteran suicide but there wasn't a veterans organization that focused on the surviving family. As I thought about this, I knew great specifics about Gold Star and researched online for an organization that had to exist that supported these surviving families as they did. There was not, so I talked to my veteran friends about starting a campaign to lobby for a Green Star Service Banner." The Green Star Family Movement had been founded.

At first, Cahill thought he would just be talking to his Congressman about the idea. He got to cross of "drafting a bill" off of his bucket list, that wasn't ever there in the first place. Enter Bill HR 5036, to the 117th Congress, read by Congressman Jefferson H. VanDrew. "That got no traction supposedly due to an incalculable number to determine the cost of having Green Star Service Banners made. That would have been an oversight on my part, but the truth of the matter is there was no department or overseeing agency that kept track of suicides so there was no number that I could put in the Bill that anybody would agree on. Hence started the 1st hurdle that is sure to only be the first of many."

The second Bill, HR 3076, was presented to the 118th Congress, and simply asked for the term "Green Star" to basically replace the statistic of "22 a Day," so that the Green Star Families of America could start

having Green Star Service Banners made and presented to families. Doing this would also allow the creation of a data base of Veterans who have been lost to suicide.

The majority of the Green Star Board are active members in the VFW. Cahill is the Post 10886 Surgeon in New Jersey. Vice President, Rich Cassey, was the Commander at his Post 7155 in PA.

They decided to pass a Green Star Resolution up through both PA & NJ VFW's. In 2023 it was voted down, and in 2024 it was passed but had anything "Green Star" related stripped out of it.

Most recently Senator Fetterman's office confirmed to them that the government has been tied up by big organizations such as TAPS, Gold Star, & MOAA trying to fit a square peg in a round hole. "They want a definition of what a Gold Star is, and they want veteran suicides to fit in that definition. The problem is that any language that would include Veteran Suicide under Gold Star would have to do with dying from a service related illness or injury....which would include all deaths from things like agent orange and other service related long term conditions that all the veterans I have spoken with, including myself, do NOT believe should be placed under the Gold Star banner."

With insights gained from their previous two bills, they have refined the approach. The revised bill asks Congress to direct the Joint Executive Committee (JEC)—established under Public Law 97-174 in 1982—to provide crucial data that has previously stalled progress. The main issue? Determining the number of Veterans lost to suicide since 9/11 and the cost of producing Green Star Service Banners for their immediate family members.

So why wait? Why not just go ahead and make the banners to hand out themselves? Cahill has two reasons. "I tell people of a conversation I had with one mother who lost her son to suicide, she said ***"Please do this right for if it is not, I fear false hope would be worse than no hope."*** I understood, and I also did not want to give false hope that the presentation of our banner to ever be confused with follow on benefits...until there were benefits recognized by the federal government."

The movement has a lot of support anywhere Cahill goes. They all believe it is a big endeavor, and hope that it would be able

to get through the bureaucracies and championed by representatives who will do more than just talk about supporting veterans.

"Imagine our generation to be the one that doesn't just ignore and stigmatize mental health, but actually finds truly effective means to diagnose, treat, and eradicate the causes of veteran suicide." Cahill said.

Bonnie Carroll, founder of the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS), is a longtime hero of Cahills, for her work and belief that mental health must be focused on and solved, the same way that the Gold Star has done with improvements in Trauma medicine and surviving common battlefield injuries. Cahill believes the Green Star will be just as effective.

While the Grass Roots efforts started with their inception in 2020, they hit roadblock after roadblock on social media with community standards. "How can any stigma be overcome when you can't even say/type suicide, \$uicide, the S word, or unaliving oneself?" Cahill said. They finally gained traction after TikTok's reboot. "In one day, our Facebook page started a group called Green Star Starlings and over 40 people signed in. All at the same time other organizations were reaching out, podcasts were calling and scheduling interviews and a song is in the works. Many good things all at once."

"Even though it sometimes feels hopeless, I have this unshakable belief that the Green Star Service Banner will become a reality. It's like when you find yourself standing alone, doing the right thing, while everyone else just follows the norm without questioning it. But when you finally step back and ask, 'Why are we accepting this?'—you realize there's no good reason. And once that question is asked, change becomes possible. Basically, I guess I'm working to work myself out of a job. Only then will I be able to truly retire." Cahill said.

Welcome Home Petty Officer Frye



US Sailor Neil Daniel Frye was killed on December 7, 1941, while aboard the USS West Virginia during the attack on Pearl Harbor in Hawaii. On what would have been his 104th birthday he was welcomed home in a ceremony at his home church in Vass, Frye Chapel, to standing room only, and an overflow in the churchyard.

Frye's remains were identified by Scientists from the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) in September of 2024.

Frye enlisted at age 19, and was only 20 when the attack happened. The Navy was still segregated at the time; Pastor Mayhue spoke of this at the service "Joining the Navy as a black man in the 40's was hard. Neil was brave enough to stand for our country, even in the face of segregation. Someone saw in him something greater, and he became a supervisor, he specialized in his work. He became Petty Officer 3rd Class, an E4. They saw that he was a good soldier. Now, as 2 Timothy says, he is a good soldier of Christ, and he is in first class with God."

Cordelia Frye Challenger, a veteran herself, gave a testimony saying "The enemy did not win, as we were able to bring our brother back home. For that we give glory to God. He paid the ultimate price, and where would we be without him? Death, you have no sting here."

Frye posthumously awarded the Purple Heart Medal, Combat Action Ribbon, American Defense Service Medal with Fleet Clasp, and the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with Bronze Star. His name now bears a rosette at the Tablets of the Missing, marking his identification and proper burial.

He will be interred at Sandhills Veteran Cemetery at Fort Bragg.


