



The VFW Foundation has had a busy year! More and more, groups who aid Veterans and their families, are coming out of the "covid slump" and beginning to become active again. The Foundation is proud to support a number of programs of the Department of North Carolina VFW. Those programs include NC Disaster Relief, Veterans Relief Fund, and Voice of Democracy. For over 3 years the Foundation has fully funded the Voice of Democracy Essay Scholarship Program, guaranteeing that each District winner will receive a minimum of **\$1,000** in scholarships to help further their higher education. Over the next 3 years, we have **\$150,000+** designated for these VFW programs, and just recently the Foundation voted to increase our contribution for NC Disaster Relief approximately **\$60,000**. These totals do not include the thousands of dollars the Foundation has already given to NC VFW programs over the past 5 years.

In addition to Department of North Carolina programs, the Veterans Foundation of NC is always looking for new ways to support needy NC Veterans and their families. We fund Guitars for Vets which provides lessons and a free guitar to each NC Veteran who completes the 1-10-lesson course. Veterans Healing Farm in Hendersonville, NC provides NC Veterans the opportunity to work on an actual farm as well as attend numerous workshops on topics as diverse as "Starting Your Own Farm", working on an active farm, partnering with Warrior Canine Connection to train service dogs for NC Veterans, and "Depression and How to Deal with It".

Produce grown on the farm is distributed to NC Veterans at the VA in Asheville and other locations in Western North Carolina. This year the farm grew and donated over **5,000 pounds** of vegtables and a variety of flowers to Veterans and produced approximately **220 bottles** of honey from their bee hives.

The Foundation also supported Footbridge Free Dental Care for Vets in NC providing exams, x-rays, cleanings, fillings, extractions and crowns. In 2022, Footbridge held 2 Dental Clinics and served **580** patients all at no charge.

In 2023 the Foundation will help support 4 Honor Flights in NC to Washington, DC to visit the memorials at no cost to the Veterans. **Respectfully Submitted,**

As Veteran's Day approached, members from the **Captain Mark Garner VFW Post 7794** found themselves returning to school. They were invited into Elkin Elementary school by teachers, Jennifer Hudspeth and Denise Cordovato to speak with students on the meaning of Veteran's Day. Nine members from VFW Post found themselves bombarded and nearly overrun with questions by a jubilant group of second and third graders who wanted to know what it was like to fly helicopters, be in a submarine or crawl in the mud. Well now they know, thanks to our Veterans like Jon Garing (photo top right), an Army Vietnam Helicopter pilot who told the young students kinda what it was like to fly in that war. Quickly shifting gears and making the children laugh, was Navy Vietnam Veteran Meade Lott (photo top right), who served on several submarines. Mead told his story of how they would often go to sea for several weeks at a time. According to Meade, a crew of 74 men and 10 officers had only one bottle of water per man to wash withwhich meant no showers.

Humana Welcomes Home Vietnam Veterans with Pinning Ceremonies

From small towns to large cities across the nation, 2.7 million young Americans were sent more than 8,000 miles from home to serve in the Vietnam War. After returning to the states, many Vietnam veterans weren't welcomed home publicly or recognized for serving their country.

Humana works to make sure all Vietnam War-era service members receive the warm welcome and recognition they deserve. For several years, Humana has conducted pinning ceremonies nationwide to honor and thank Vietnam veterans for their service and sacrifice.

In 2012, President Barack Obama and Congress established the Vietnam War Commemoration program to recognize the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. The 13-year-long Vietnam War Commemoration enlists Commemorative Partner organizations at the local, state and national levels to conduct pinning events and activities that honor 6.2 million Vietnam War-era veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time from Nov. 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of duty location, and their 9 million family members.

Humana is a Commemorative Partner and has participated in pinning ceremonies nationwide to provide veterans with a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin as a thank you from our nation.

This year, Humana has distributed the commemorative pins to hundreds of veterans across the country at many events, including:

- Oklahoma History Center pinning ceremony on March 29 in Oklahoma City
- Rolling to Remember in Washington, D.C., during Memorial Day Weekend
- Heroes Honor Festival on May 28 in Daytona Beach, Florida
- Pinning ceremony at Jim Taylor VFW Post 8845 on June 16 in Fort Smith, Arkansas
- Commemorative ceremonies on Aug. 20 in Gulfport, Mississippi, and on Sept. 16 in Honolulu
- Stockton Ports Hats Off to Heroes Night on Sept. 3 in Stockton, California

Humana has conducted more than 80 pinning and proclamation ceremonies since 2017, and it will continue to sponsor these events to show its appreciation to Vietnam War-era veterans and provide the welcome home they have waited years to receive.

The Vietnam War Commemoration will continue through Nov. 11, 2025.

District 8 Comrades and Auxiliary members hosted a Buddy Poppy Membership Drive at








the annual Welcome Home Heroes Chili Cook Off Community fundraiser.

BILLY RAY CAMERON MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Billy Ray Cameron Memorial Golf Tournament was held Saturday August 27th at Twin Oaks Golf Club in Statesville, NC. VFW Post 2031 hosted the very successful event.

For those new to the Department of North Carolina VFW, Billy Ray Cameron was born in Lee County, NC. He served his country from 1966 to 1969 in the U.S. Marine Corp, served as NC State Commander from 1975-1976, and was the very first Vietnam War Veteran to be elected to the position of National Commander-in-Chief in 1984.

The two day memorial event began on Friday with a golf practice round. Saturday morning started with the Statesville local American Legion Post 65 present the colors followed by taps. A four-man Captain's choice format was played on Saturday with closest to the pin, putting contest and a 50/50 draw after the round. Food was served before and after the round at the clubhouse and a "Pig Pickin" and "Chicken Pluckin" was held at the Post picnic area that evening. Several districts and numerous posts sponsored the two-day event as well as 41 sponsors ranging from \$100 to \$500. In addition, 25 teams participated from all over the State. Statesville was honored with the attendance of VFW State Commander Tim Woods, Senior Vice Commander Helen Nelson; Junior Vice Commander Annie Cummings; Chaplin Alicia Judd and VFW State Service Officer Jay Wood. Others in attendance were 14th District Commander Art Gordon, 12th District Commander Bobbi Sheets; Past State Commander Allen Payne who also served as the Tournament Chairman and VFW Post 2031 Commander Terry Dagenhart.
