The wounded, the sick and their struggling families were left to fend for themselves. A visionary band of veterans formed what would later become the VFW. We exist to protect and defend those who have sacrificed for this nation. You've earned that.

We strategically put our legislative muscle to work on The Hill every day. Standing up for your rights. Fighting to protect funding for critical veterans' programs. Mobilizing grassroots support to create a citizenry of informed, engaged veterans' advocates. Getting the job done...







VFW leadership testifies regularly before Congress. As a united voice for veterans everywhere, we make our voices heard on legislation and proposals that affect you.

Our grassroots lobbying efforts are carried out by the Action Corps. **VFW's Action Corps influences the passage or defeat of legislation in the best interests of veterans and service members** by writing, visiting and calling congressional officials. VFW has been instrumental in nearly every major legislative victory for veterans in the 20th and 21st centuries. Among them:

1920, Widows & Orphans Pension Act (Spanish-American War)

1930, Veterans Administration (VA) established

1933, Wagner-Peyser Act: Veterans Employment Service

1936, Bonus bonds (\$2.4 billion) to WWI vets redeemable

1944, G.I. Bill of Rights (P.L. 346); Veterans Preference Act

1952, Veterans Readjustment Assistance Act (Korean War G.I. Bill)

1954, Veterans Compensation Act

1962, Veterans Benefits Act (Cold War G.I. Bill)

1966, Veterans Readjustment Benefits Act (P.L. 89-358) (Vietnam War G.I. Bill)

1978, Veterans preference preserved

1981, Former POW Benefits Act 1984, Montgomery G.I. Bill

1989, VA becomes a Cabinet department

1991, Agent Orange Act (P.L. 102-4)

1999, Veterans Millennium Health Care and Benefits Act 2004, Full concurrent receipt for military retirees rated 100% disabled (P.L. 108-375)

2005, Traumatic Injury Insurance supplemental created (S. 806)

2006, Protestors banned from military funerals (H.R. 5037)

2007, VFW calls for VA/military health care system review after Walter Reed outpatient debacle

2008, Record VA discretionary budget approved; G.I. Bill for the 21st Century signed into law (Post-9/11 G.I. Bill)

2009, Advanced Appropriations for VA becomes law

2010, Family Caregiver
Legislation signed into law;
Ensured all VA and DOD health
care programs were recognized
as meeting minimum coverage
standards under national
health care law

2011, VOW to Hire Heroes Act; Stopped annual TRICARE premium increases

2012, Ensured all veterans' programs were exempt from mandatory federal budget cuts through sequestration
